### Regular City Council Meeting - 1st Wednesday

The City of Pine City Council met in Regular City Council Meeting - 1st Wednesday on Wednesday, June 7, 2023 at 6:30 PM in the City Hall Council Chambers.

#### 4. PUBLIC FORUM

This is an opportunity for citizens to present items to the Council that are not on the agenda. Each presentation is limited to three (3) minutes and a maximum of fifteen minutes is set aside. If your item needs follow-up from the City, Staff will arrange for that.

#### 4.1. TERRY NEITZEL - 720 2ND AVE SW, PINE CITY, MN 55063

Mr. Neitzel addresses the Council regarding an ongoing concern with a neighboring property. The property was listed as an agenda topic for this meeting and was discussed later in the meeting.

#### 4.2. DANIEL SWANSON - 118 6TH AVE SE, PINE CITY, MN 55063

Mr. Swanson addressed the Council on behalf of the Pine City Baseball Association regarding the updates and improvements made at the Pine City Softball Fields. He thanked the Council for all of the improvements and stated they greatly appreciate all of the work.

#### 4.3. WAYNE OLSON - 880 MAIN ST. S., PINE CITY, MN 55063

Mr. Olson addressed the Council regarding his Fire Bill he received. He would like his bill sent to the gas company. He stated the gas company admitted the gas line was in the wrong spot and are going to move the line for him. Mayor Pederson informed Mr. Olson that his logic was good and he needed to bring the bill to the gas company. This item is to be added to the next agenda for further discussion.

#### 5. SHERIFF UPDATE

5.1.

Deputy was present and stated there was 9 calls at Hilltop Cottages which is about the norm. He brought up that they are getting a fair amount of bear calls in town. Mayor Pederson stated it would be a good idea to put the DNR contact phone number on the City's website for nuisance bears in town.

#### 6. PUBLIC HEARINGS / PRESENTATIONS / CORRESPONDENCE

# 6.1. PUBLIC HEARING - ORDINANCE 20230607-04 - AMENDING SUBSECTION (D) OF 3.28.030 CEMETERY LAND USE OF THE PINE CITY MUNICIPAL CODE.

This was a request from Public Works and Ordinance Committee. Jim France asked if this was the same as what the V.A. does. Maury stated it was and we were just clearing up the language.

## 6.2. PUBLIC HEARING - ORDINANCE 20230607-05 - CHAPTER 5.12 LAWFUL GAMBLING OF THE PINE CITY MUNICIPAL CODE.

City Administrator Scott Hildebrand stated that since we don't actually report to the State and that this Ordinance has not been enforced, the language needed updating. The President, Krissy Valvoda, from Pine City Youth Hockey confirmed that everything in red was being removed and thanked the Council for updating this ordinance.

## 6.3. PUBLIC HEARING - ORDINANCE 20230607-06 - PERMITTING LAND ANNEXATION

Community Development Director Mike Gainor addressed the Council regarding the roughly 60 acre parcel request for annexation to create more housing locations within City limits.

Roger Else - 925 Link Dr. SE, Pine City, MN 55063 addressed the Council and wanted to know what it was going to cost the City to bring water and sewer to the annexed property.

**Shawn Linnell from Pine City Township** addressed the Council regarding Freedom Road located in Pine City Township that runs along the potentially annexed property. He stated it costs the Township roughly \$4,400 a mile to maintain the road. He would like to work with the City regarding the maintenance of Freedom Road if they do put housing in. He would like to see and Orderly Annexation and be involved with any future development of the property. Linnell would also like to be notified of any meetings regarding the annexation of this property

#### 6.4. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE PUBLIC HEARING - ORDINANCE 20230607-07 PUBLIC CONSUMPTION

#### Daniel Swanson - 118 6th Ave SE, Pine City, MN 55063

Mr. Swanson addressed the Council and would like to see a permit to have alcohol in the park. He stated that alcohol should not be around playgrounds at all for sure. He stated that if you can't go to a park and not drink, you have a problem.

#### Mike Odell -

Mr. Odell stated he agrees with Mr. Swanson and if the City is going to allow alcohol than they should allow cigarettes and cannabis.

#### Adrienne Roubinek - 225 9th St. SW, Pine City, MN 55063

Mrs. Roubinek addressed the Council stating she has been involved with Art in the Park for roughly 46 years and has not had an issue with alcohol at any function. She stated she will not be the beer police at Art in the Park and will not go around asking

everyone what is in their cups or koozies. She agrees with having an ordinance in place for anything that potentially may go wrong even knowing she doesn't think anything will.

#### Mollie Davis - 440 5th Ave NE, Pine City, MN 55063

Mrs. Davis suggested to Council about maybe having a park or two that is alcohol free.

#### 8. OLD BUSINESS

8.1. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING WATER METER TESTING

#### Mollie Davis - 440 5th Ave NE, Pine City, MN 55063

Mrs. Davis addressed the Council stating her bill is what it is. She stated that she knows of the City's Leakage Policy and assumed the City was not going to offer her that.

8.2. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING FIRE ON THE SNAKE.

Councilor Palmer abstained due to his affliation with the Pine City Fire Department. Hildebrand stated that if we allow one non-profit organization use our City Offices, we are going to have to be open to allowing other non-profit organization to use any and all City Offices. Fire Chief Tom Miller stated that this needs to be a seasonal thing for the Fire Department as trucks and apparatus can not be left outside in the winter. Along with if they do do this, there needs to be City employees on site for security purposes and movement of City equipment.

Moved by Councilor David Hill, seconded by Councilor Steve Ovick, The Council wants a policy in place before any organization uses City offices and they want to see it. Carried unanimously

#### 9. NEW BUSINESS

## 9.1. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING APPOINTMENT TO THE PLANNING COMMISSION.

Mayor Pederson stated that anything the Council does is business and not personal to anyone. Councilor Hill elaborated on Mayor Pederson and also stated that Mr. Swanson needs to remember to be objective and always do what is best for the City and Community.

## 9.2. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING RESOLUTION 20230607-14, APPROVING PARTICIPATION IN A JOINT GRANT TO RESEARCH A POTENTIAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Fire Chief Tom Miller explained why they went with a \$50,000 instead of the normal \$35,000-\$38,000 amount. They wanted to count for inflation, but do not see it being that high. He also explained that the study will show the Council if the fire district is added or if it should stay combined along with where we are with fire calls. It is just a study that needs to be done.

# 9.3. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING RESOLUTION 20230607-15 - ADOPTING THE STANDARD ALLOWANCE RECOMMENDATION FOR ARPA FUNDS.

City Administrator Hildebrand explained that the Auditors suggested the City have a Resolution in place for the ARPA Standard Allowance.

## 9.4. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING FORCED ABATEMENT

Fire and Life Safety Inspector Adam Zemek addressed the Council stating that at 11:00am on 6/7/2023 he was at the property and spoke with the residents. They stated that there was a dumpster to be delivered on 6/7/2023 but found at 6:15pm there was still no dumpster at the property. Council approved the Forced Abatement of the property and stated there needs to be a company ready to go as soon as the 30 days is up to clean up the property and charges will be assessed to the owners property taxes.

**Tonya Miller -** Mrs. Miller stated that the City needs to put in an ordinance or something that if there is no power, gas, water, sewer to a home, something needs to be done immediately. This is a public problem - a mental health problem.

#### Terry Neitzel - 720 2nd Ave SW, Pine City, MN 55063

Mr. Neitzel addressed the Council and wants to see the residents gone.

Mayor Pederson asked Adam Zemek if social services were able to help and he stated they are not since there is no children involved. Adam Zemek brought up potentially adding the Property Maintenance Code that the State of Minnesota has and that the City should adopt it with it's own revisions. Adam also stated that he contacted East Central Energy to find out what needs to be done to reconnect the electric and was informed that the wiring had been torn out and that the home would need to be state inspected to reconnect power.

Councilor Pettie inquired about animals and Council was made aware that the residents do in fact have animals and the cats are really hurting.

Public Works Supervisor Maury Montbriand spoke about the difference in the tractor bids. Councilor Ovick stated he would like to move forward with the bid from Stan's Equipment.
