The City of Pine City Council met in Regular Morning Meeting on Thursday, September 21, 2023 at 10:00 AM in the City Hall Council Chambers.

CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pederson called the meeting to order at 10:00 am.

ROLL CALL

Mayor Pederson and Councilors Ovick, Hill, and Palmer were all present.
Councilor Gina Pettie was absent.

CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Councilor Hill made a motion to approve the agenda, Councilor Ovick second the motion. Motion carried with Mayor Pederson and Councilor Palmer voting aye.

Mr. Neitzel addressed the Council regarding an ongoing concern with a neighboring property. He was provide an update from our Fire and Life Safety Inspector and Planning and Zoning Department.

Daniel Swanson - 118 6th Ave SE, Pine City, MN 55063

Mr. Swanson addressed the Council regarding an ongoing concern at 600 2nd Ave SE regarding overgrowth of plants and trees of a neighboring property. It has become a safety concern and would like the trees and shrubs cut back. Public Works Supervisor stated he will look at it and get it taken care of.
