Regular City Council Meeting

The City of Pine City Council met in Regular City Council Meeting on Wednesday, May 31, 2023 at 5:00 PM in the City Hall Council Chambers.

CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pederson called the meeting to order at 5:00pm.

CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA

BUSINESS

 a) DISCUSSION REGARDING RFP AND FUTURE VISIONING FOR OLD CITY HALL, 315 MAIN STREET

City Administrator Hildebrand addressed the Council regarding 315 Main Street. He requested input from the Council and all present regarding direction moving forward with the project and presented several possible options including lease purchase bonding. Hiring a lobbyist was a suggestion. Councilor Palmer inquired about the amount of money required to operate the Government Center annually. Councilor Palmer also indicated that he thought a referendum should be utilized to understand the thoughts of the citizens. Council agreed to consider any and all possible options and return to the topic. No action was taken.

b) DISCUSSION REGARDING OPTIONS FOR USE OF ARPA FUNDS

City Administrator Hildebrand presented several items for possible use of ARPA funds. Those included several parks and recreation items. Other items discussed were: Flashing lights at crosswalks, adding docks, wifi in the parks, asphalt project at Hilltop. Administrator Hildebrand was tasked with pricing out these suggestions and bring them back to Council. No action was taken.
